### BAGRS Board Meeting – 18 October 2009

10:05 AM meeting called to order

### **Board members present:**

Don Watters, Russ Miller, Dennis Mack, Ray Turner, Frank Lucas, Johannes Hoech,

# **Topics:**

- Secretary's Report: Minutes:
  - o Johannes read the August 2009 minutes, which were approved
- Treasurer's Report (Chip Gierhart was not here, Don reported in his stead):
  - Financial Condition
    - No substantial change
    - Trailer down payment has been made
  - 2009 Budget vs. Actual
    - We are on track with membership and expenses
  - Conservatory of Flowers
    - We're planning to support the Conservatory setup; all's on track and Jack and the Conservatory folks are pleased
    - The work crew for the effort looks good:
      - Bill Allen and Terry Hurley (sp?) will build buildings
      - Kermit Paul is building a cable car
      - Jack may personally organize construction crew
      - Everything has to be done between Nov 7 and 16<sup>th</sup>
      - We will need to train their staff on operating the layout
    - There most likely won't be special parking for volunteers
    - We will have a separate children's display at the conservatory; Ray passed out a general floor plan
      - Keep it simple, just a standard loop raised off the floor

- Use LGB track since it's very rigid and can be bent to shape
- Chip acquired three Thomas Tank Engine type trains
- Give it a European flavor; add tunnels and bridges, etc.
- Use an acrylic screen to keep fingers off this 4ft deep layout
- The total budget is about \$2,200; \$500 more for DCC
  - Chip spent \$600 on the Thomas engines on eBay
- The group felt that installing DCC was overkill and not worth the cost
  - The biggest concern would be the reliability of the Tank engines, there being a risk of wearing out the gears which we could minimize by adding a momentum switch
- The current plan is for a simple "Figure 8" layout without any switches
  - About half of the track will be set up on trestles
  - There will be a cable car off to the side
  - A car will run back and forth on the Golden Gate Bridge
  - The layout will be about 2 ft off the ground
- Ray made a motion, Johannes seconded it, that we spent approx. \$2K
  to finance the layout without the DCC
  - Motion was approved

#### Action Items:

- Add an announcement in the T&T to popularize the children's layout concept at the conservatory (Ray)
- Nancy and Johannes talk to Chip to find out how to get plugged into commensurate marketing efforts
- Russ will work with Chip to do a poster design for the conservatory events
- Scheduling Coordinator's Report (Ray Turner):

- We discussed having the Mega Weekends more localized to specific districts
  - The market research data suggests that people don't want to drive as far to open houses
  - There we no complaints from the Mega Weekend, and there was a feeling that we shouldn't open too many open houses so we don't dilute the potential visitors to a given layout
  - There was extensive discussion then of whether or not we should encourage many displays to be open vs. keep the no. of displays more limited

# o Action Items:

- Set up a Superintendents' meeting to make a policy decision on whether or not we want to encourage a lot of open houses or stay more focused to drive more traffic to a fewer set of open houses (Ray)
- Market Segmentation Report (Johannes Hoech):
  - Objectives/Approach
    - Johannes outlined the approach to this project based on his October
      16 email to the board
    - A request for Committee Members was discussed
  - Action Items:
    - Put a note in the newsletter (Johannes to work with Jennifer Miller)
    - Send an email to the board asking for interested board members (Ray and Don expressed interest), as well as for suggested additional participants (Johannes)
- Public Outreach (Nancy Norris):
  - Trailer Progress:
    - The trailer vendor is promising to commence construction within two or three weeks; start date pending shipping from the manufacturing location to Martinez
  - o Action Items: No action items
- Membership Report (Frank Lucas):

- Frank changed the cutoff date
- We're now 289 members with a few lapsed and former members returned
- He got some folks interested in trains when he offered a nighttime showing
- The question was raised that we talk about more than G-Scale gauge, e.g. can we work on 0-Gauge layouts
  - The group felt that scale is not an issue, we're about "garden railroading" irrespective of scale
- The good news is we're growing back up to 300, i.e. we are reversing the decline in membership
- We talked about how to maintain a tight relationship with the Shortline to enable both sides to benefit from cross-marketing synergies
- Action Items: No action items
- Baggage Car (Dennis Mack):
  - We're driving down out inventory
  - We have a good vendor that helps; they carry all the interim inventory
  - Action Items:
    - Maybe increase quality of art work (**Dennis**)
    - Figure out how to add a T-Shirt sales pitch to a new member application (**Dennis** to work with Chip on how to do that)
- <u>Live Steamer Report</u> (Richard Murray):
  - Had their last meet at Ardenwood with great attendance from members and visitors
  - LS was at Just Trains and got a new member, everyone is doing a great job pitching for members
  - LS wants to thank Jennifer Miller about publishing all their pictures
  - o Action Items: No action items
